Regular VERB Tenses

A regular verb uses regular rules to change tense and number. A regular present tense verb becomes past by adding -<u>ed</u>. A regular plural verb becomes singular through the addition of -<u>s</u> or -<u>es</u>.

Present infinitive form: to dance Past participle: danced Future: will dance

A perfect tense requires a helping verb to add direction to the action of the verb.

Present perfect: Kelly has danced for several years. Past perfect: He had danced on Broadway since age 13. Future perfect: Ian will have danced with every girl.
